Transfer Station:

The City of Bristol Transfer Station is located at 685 Lake Avenue. Residential permits are \$20.00 for the calendar year. Hours of operation are Monday through Friday 7:15 AM to 2:45 PM, and Saturday 7:30 AM to 1:00 PM.

- Public Works provides recycle bins to residents who have curbside rubbish collection.
- Leaf mulch/wood chips (spring/summer) and sand (winter) are available at the Dog Pound on Vincent P. Kelly Road.

***There will be no collection schedule change for the 2010 Christmas or New Years holidays. ***

There is no curbside collection on City holidays. When a holiday falls on a weekday, all collections for that day (rubbish, recycle, yard waste, etc.) will be collected the following day. All collections for the remainder of the week are delayed by one day, with the exception of Yard Waste collection. Yard Waste will remain on the regular collection schedule except for the holiday day. (Ex.– on a Monday holiday, Monday Yard Waste will be collected on Tuesday, Tuesday through Friday routes will be collected on their normal day). **The Transfer Station is also closed in observance of the holidays.**

Bulk Pick up:

Residential properties are entitled to one free bulk pick up per calendar year. We will collect up to 5 cubic yards of acceptable "bulky waste" at the curb. Call to schedule a pick up!

Brush Pick up:

Public Works also collects brush/branches at the curb by appointment. Branches must be less than 6" in diameter, 4' in length and securely bundled. Call to schedule.

Holiday tree collection:

Each year Public Works collects holiday trees at the curb for the first two weeks of January.

Household Hazardous Waste (October 2, 2010) & Electronic Waste Collection: Check the web site for more information.

Yard Waste Service:

Public Works offers a curbside yard waste collection service for \$85.00 per year. Yard Waste barrels are emptied weekly from April to November.

Leaf Bag Collection:

Curbside, every spring and fall.

Catch Basin/Storm Drains:

Call us if a catch basin is not functioning, is clogged, or the cover, hood or grate is off or missing.

Street Sweeping:

Street sweeping is done each year in the spring, from April to June.

Water Pollution Control

WPC Operates and maintains wastewater collection & treatment facilities.

Water Pollution Control is responsible for the City's sewer lines. Residents are responsible for the sewer line from their home to the City's line in the middle of the street.

Manholes: Call WPC if water is coming out from under a 24" diameter round manhole cover in the street or if the manhole cover is missing, loose or sticking up.

Sewer Backups: Water actively backing up into a basement through plumbing fixtures (i.e. toilet, sink drain, shower drain) may be a problem with the City's sewer line.

When basement plumbing fixtures (below street level) begin to drain slowly, we can investigate to see if there is a problem with the City's sewer line.

There is no charge for us to investigate!
