Reconstruction of Mix Street Phase II
City of Bristol CT

The City of Bristol is seeking bids for the reconstruction of a portion of Mix Street, consisting of the realignment of the intersection at Maltby and Mix Streets, full depth reconstruction, resurfacing, drainage upgrades, and other work necessary to complete the project. A non-mandatory bidder's conference will be held on Tuesday March 30, 2010 at 3:00 pm in the First Floor Meeting Room, City Hall, Bristol CT.

Bids will be accepted until **Tuesday, April 13, 2010 at 3:00 pm**, at which time bids will be opened and read. Bids received after the opening date and time will not be considered for award. Bidders must be pre-qualified for site work by the State of Connecticut Department of Administrative Services ("DAS") for consideration of this project. The City reserves the right to waive any informalities in the bid, to reject any or all bids, and to accept the bid that in its judgment is in its best interest.

Each bid shall be in a sealed envelope addressed to the City of Bristol Purchasing Department, identified as "Bid 2C10-088 Reconstruction of Mix Street Phase II" accompanied by a Bid Security in the amount of 10% of the bidders base bid amount, in the form of a Bid Bond made payable to the City of Bristol.

The awarded contractor will be required to secure a Performance Bond and a Labor and Materials Bond, each in the amount of 100% of the contract award, provided by a surety licensed to do business in the State of Connecticut. The requirements for prevailing wage rates as outlined in Connecticut General Statutes 31-53 are to apply to the resultant contract award.

CFR 176.170 Notice of Required Use of American Iron, Steel, and Manufactured Goods (covered under International Agreements) - Section 1605 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009: Section 1605 of the Recovery Act requires that projects, funded by the Recovery Act, for the construction, alteration, maintenance, or repair of a public building or public work use American iron, steel, and manufactured goods in the project unless one of the specified exemptions applies. The Act provides that this requirement be applied in a manner consistent with U.S. obligations under international agreements.

Definition: Designated country iron, steel, and/or manufactured goods, foreign iron, steel, and/or manufactured good, manufactured good, public building and public work, and steel, as used in this provision, are defined in 2 CFR 176.160(a).

Equal Employment Opportunity - Executive Order 11246 and 41 CFR Part 60: The Bidder's attention is called to the "Equal Opportunity Clause" and the "Standard Federal Equal Employment Opportunity Construction Contract Specifications" set forth within the supplementary provisions. The successful Bidder shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, or national origin. The Contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
