A **mandatory** bidder's conference will be held on Thursday, March 10, 2011 at 11:00 am at the project site, located at 260 Central Street, Bristol, CT 06010. Bids will not be considered from contractors who were not present at said meeting.

Bids will be accepted until **Thursday, March 24, 2011 at 11:00 am**, at which time bids will be opened and read. Bids received after the opening date and time will not be considered for award. The City reserves the right to waive any informalities in the bid, to reject any or all bids, and to accept the bid that in its judgment is in its best interest.

Each bid shall be in a sealed envelope addressed to the City of Bristol Purchasing Department, identified as "Bid 2C11-072 Renovations to F. N. Manross Memorial Library" accompanied by a Bid Bond in the amount of 10% of the bidders base bid amount, in the form of a Bid Bond made payable to the City of Bristol.

The awarded contractor will be required to secure a Performance Bond and a Labor and Materials Bond, each in the amount of 100% of the contract award, provided by a surety licensed to do business in the State of Connecticut. The requirements for prevailing wage rates as outlined in Connecticut General Statutes 31-53 are to apply to the resultant contract award.
